



## Supporting Children with Autism and Other Developmental Delays in Early Childhood Education Settings

Presented by Oregon Program for Autism Training Sites & Support (OrPATS)

This training opportunity will provide preschool staff, child care staff, and Head Start staff with a greater understanding of working with children with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) enrolled in their center. Topics discussed will include learning characteristics of ASD, behavioral strategies, and simple activities to encourage social and language skill development. This workshop will provide specific examples of evidence-based practices that can be implemented immediately in the child care setting.

Child care providers, Head Start staff, registered/certified family child care providers, teachers, assistants, and other staff providing services to children with autism or other developmental delays.
